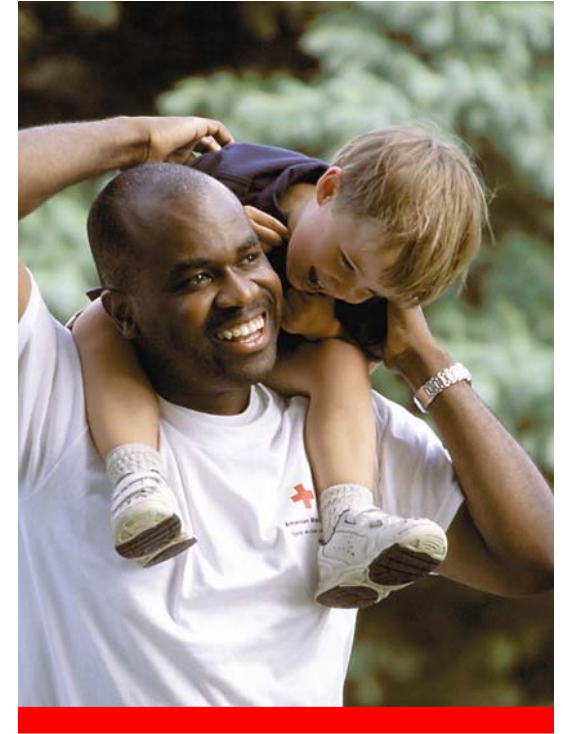

The Red Cross in Our Community

Disaster Services

When a disaster threatens or strikes, the Red Cross is there. This year we responded to nearly 200 local disasters. We helped more than 500 affected individuals and families with emergency food, shelter and supplies.

Because being prepared can make your family and community safer and sometimes minimize injury and destruction, we provided 2,954 Idahoans with free disaster education materials and information.

Health and Safety Services

From first aid, CPR and AED training to swimming and lifeguarding, American Red Cross programs help people lead safer and healthier lives. This year, 19,674 individuals learned lifesaving skills through health and safety classes offered by the chapter.

International Services

The international tracing program helps local families find relatives with whom they have lost contact because of a natural disaster, war or internal conflict. In FY09, we provided international services to 25 Idaho families looking to reconnect with loved ones.

Services to Armed Forces (SAF)

The American Red Cross provides emergency communications, deployment support and other services to members of the military, their families and veterans. In FY09, we provided SAF services to 1,986 of these brave individuals so they could serve our country.

Community Services

Often the American Red Cross is contacted regarding services outside the scope of our mission. In these cases, we do everything we can to provide a link to other community agencies and services so no need goes unanswered. We support the community by providing referrals and/or information to those seeking help with such needs as medical services, assistance with transportation, and utility or rent payments.

A Note About Volunteers

We depend on volunteers of all ages and backgrounds to carry on our work. Volunteers constitute 94 percent of our total workforce, serving as members of the board, instructors teaching lifesaving skills, disaster action team members, office administrators, event organizers and more.

This year, 324 volunteers made the work of the chapter possible. These selfless individuals contributed approximately 31,104 hours, for a contribution estimated at \$203,731.
